Where We've Been...

Dependent on other swimming organizations' officials

Scrambling for "anyone can help on deck!"

Minimal to poor coverage at some meets

"USMS has its own rules??"

"Breaststroke kick is legal in Fly??"

Starters and Stroke & Turn Judges

Certified by an approved body in that capacity

 Uncertified officials may serve in that capacity if they have received training and are under direct supervision of a certified official

Referees

Certified as a referee by an approved body

 Certified starters or stroke & turn judges may serve as referee if they have received training

History of USMS Officials

- USMS meet officials certified by other entities:
 - USA Swimming
 - YMCA
 - NFHS (high school)
 - NCAA/CSOA (college)
 - FINA
- No USMS national certification program (pre 2016)

History of USMS Officials

Consequences:

- Inadequate numbers of officials available in different LMSCs
- Some LMSCs pay officials for meets, some only for championships, some not at all
- Distinctions between USMS and other rule books often not well-enforced



Where We Are Going...

Grow our Own!

- USMS members recruited to USMS officiating
- Athletes can both compete and officiate
- USMS culture and rules naturally enforced
- All teams encouraged to recruit officials
- No meets go understaffed

National Certification Program Launched 2016 to create a standardized national certification for officials – *GROW OUR OWN!*

Stage One: Stroke & Turn and Starters

Rolled out June 2016

Appendix B amended to include USMS as a certifying body

Primarily a video and testing-based training – uses USA Swimming online testing and tests against USA Swimming rule book and USMS Addendum National Certification Program

Stage Two: Develop USMS-Certified Referees

Certified Referees capable of serving a variety of meets from small, one-session LSMC meets to eventual experience at USMS National Championships

Very different training protocol: experience, testing, and mentoring based training

Experience

- Previous certification by USMS as a Starter & S&T
- Served a minimum of four sessions as a Starter at USMS meets
- LMSCs may define additional prerequisites based on local needs and conditions

Testing

- Study the USMS
 Referee's Self Training Manual
- Take three tests and achieve passing grade of 80% on each:
 - USA Swimming Referee Test
 - USA Swimming Timing Judge Test
 - USMS
 Supplemental
 Referee's Test
 (separate site)



Mentoring

- Review the other deck positions at a meet, including Clerk of Course, Starter, Stroke & Turn Judge, Chief Judge, Timing Judge and Meet Marshal
- Apprentice as Referee on-deck for a minimum of two sessions at USMS meets
- Join USMS and maintain membership





Certification Process

- Mentoring officials provide written recommendations to LMSC Officials Chair
- LMSC Officials Chair shall approve certifications to the USMS Officials Committee, updated credential card issued
- 3. Maintain certification through experience minimum 4 sessions (2 as Referee) within certification period at USMS meets.
- ❖ LMSC Officials Chairs encourage upward path

Next Steps

Referee's Self Training Manual to web site Open USMS online testing – goes live soon! Develop tools for Officials Chairs to track officials' certifications (all positions) Work with LMSCs to identify challenges and training needs Athletes / Officials – Success stories!
