102.13 Disqualifications

Rationale: The change of wording will match the current FINA language in SW 10.3 and the USA-S Rule Book (102.22.5).

This change will give the 'benefit of the doubt goes to the swimmer' action back to the Referee who can determine the appropriate action. Often it is a combination of inexperience, untrained timers, poor sound system, inability to see the scoreboard from the blocks, etc., and an inadvertent mistake. An automatic disqualification should not be mandated.

104.5.6 Club Scoring

- A Scoring—All national championship meet scoring and awards shall be treated as if the meet were swum in a 10-lane pool, regardless of the actual number of lanes available. Points shall be awarded as in article 103.19.3A.
- B Categories—Club scoring will be tabulated in two categories.
 - (1) **Regional clubs**—For competition at national championship meets, a regional club consists of a club made up of those swimmers who represent a club at nationals, but at competitions within their LMSC, they compete for an entity or subgroup (such as a workout group) that is different than the one they compete with at nationals.
 - (2) Local clubs—For competition at national championship meets, a local club consists of a club that does not qualify as a regional club.
 - (3) <u>Publication</u>—The Championship Committee shall publish a list of regional and local clubs no later than February 15 of each year. A club may contest its

designation or the designation of another club by filing an appeal with the chair of the Championship Committee at least 45 days prior to the first day of competition at the national championship meet.

C Overall point total—The overall point totals for each club shall be published in all results documentation.

- *` If USMS requests that a meet host conduct a USMS national championship meet after the season-ending date, times achieved at all USMS/FINA meets up to and including Nationals after the season-ending date (May 31 or September 30) at that meet shall be considered for USMS Top 10 for the season that just ended, not the next year's season.
- ** Should a USMS national championship meet occur after the submission deadline for that course, times from that meet meets through Nationals shall be forwarded to the Records and Tabulation chair or designee by the last day of the month in which that meet was completed or by the 15th of the following month, if the meet was held in the last two weeks of the month.

Rationale: There is no intention of not typically having national champs during the usual 45-day period currently listed in the rule book. However, with a 2021 COVID year (two nationals affected) and on two prior occasions (2012 Omaha nationals linked onto Olympic Trials and World Champs in Brisbane 1988), the Championship Committee has had to get approval from

the Rules Committee and then the USMS BOD or the HOD (for the Summer Nationals) to allow exceptions. The extra steps are cumbersome in case a possible scenario might present itself again.

However, if the season length is changed only for Nationals, it possibly creates an unmanageable data nightmare with two season-ending dates for a course. We also want to give adequate time to Top 10 recorders to submit results if a meet is held near the end of a month.

102.12 Swimwear for Pool Competition

102.12.1 Design

- A The swim suits worn for competition shall be nontransparent and conform to the current concept of the appropriate. The referee shall have authority to bar offenders from competition until they comply with this rule.
- **BA** Swimwear shall include only a swimsuit, no more than two caps, and goggles (a nose clip and ear plugs are allowed). Armbands or legbands shall not be regarded as parts of the swimsuit and are not allowed.
- **CB** In swimming competitions, the competitor must wear only one swim suit in one or two pieces. All swimsuits shall be made from textile materials. For men, the swimsuit shall not extend above the navel nor below the knees, and for women, shall not cover the neck, extend past the shoulder nor extend below the knees.
 - (1) Exemptions to the foregoing restrictions may be granted to a swimmer, on a case-by-case basis, by the chair of the Rules Committee or designee. Exemptions will be granted for conflicts due to the swimmer's verified religious beliefs, verified medical conditions, or other reasons as deemed appropriate by the chair of the Rules Committee.
 - (2) Procedures for applying for an exemption will be established by the Rules Committee and posted on the USMS website.
 - (3) No exemption to these restrictions will be granted for a swimsuit that will give the swimmer a competitive advantage.
 - (4) The decision of the Rules Committee chair may be appealed only to the entire Rules Committee, whose decision shall be final and binding on all parties.
- **DC** Only swim suits complying with FINA swim suit specifications maybe worn in any USMS sanctioned or recognized competition. Note: FINA specifications prohibit any zippers, ties, or any other fastener systems with the exception of a waist tie.
- **AD** The sSwim suits worn for competition shall be nontransparent and conform to the current concept of the appropriate. The referee shall have authority to bar offenders from competition until they comply with this rule.
- E No swimmer is permitted to wear or use any device or substance to enhance speed, pace, buoyancy, or endurance during a race (such as webbed gloves, fins, power bands, adhesive substances, snorkels, neoprene caps, etc.). Goggles may be worn,

and rubdown oil applied if not considered excessive by the referee. Medical identification items may be worn. Therapeutic elastic tape is prohibited. Any other kind of tape on the body is not permitted unless approved by the referee.

Rationale: Housekeeping. This aligns US Masters Swimming with USA Swimming Rules. It will make it easier for officials who are more familiar with USA Swimming Rules to find the applicable rule.

Pursuant to article 601.4.7, amendments to USA Swimming articles 101, 102, and 105 shall automatically be adopted by USMS unless the USMS House of Delegates votes to reject those amendments.

Amendments to USA Swimming article 103 (USMS article 106, "Facilities Standards") may be recommended by the Rules Committee for adoption by the USMS House of Delegates.

The following amendments will be submitted by the USA Swimming Rules and Regulations Committee to the USA Swimming House of Delegates for consideration at the 2022 annual meeting.

U-1 and U-3 have been withdrawn by the proposing USA Swimming LSC, pending approval by the USA Swimming House of Delegates.

U-6 and U-7 were amended after initial submission to USA Swimming. The original language was included initially in this packet, but has been updated to align with the language that will be considered by the USA Swimming HOD.

107.3 Deaf and Hard of Hearing

Visual Starting Signal—Swimmers who are deaf or hard of hearing require a visual starting signal (i.e., a strobe light and/or starter's arm signals). The referee may reassign lanes within the swimmer's heat (i.e., exchanging one lane for another) so that the strobe light or starter's arm signal can more readily be seen by the swimmer who is deaf or hard of hearing. Standard starter's arm signals are shown in Figures 1 and 2. A recall rope is required in the event of a recall, provided the meet host is notified by the entry deadline that a swimmer who is deaf or hard of hearing will be participating.

Rationale: To require use of both a strobe light and the starter's arm signals.

107.5 Physical Disabilities

(*Articles 107.5.1 and 107.5.3 are unchanged*)

107.5.2 Stroke/Kick—In judging the stroke or kick of a swimmer with a physical disability, the referee and stroke and turn judge should follow the general rule that if a part of the body is absent or cannot be used, it is not judged; a necessary stroke accommodation may be applied by the meet referee if it is used during the stroke or kick, it should be judged in accordance with the USMS rules. All other body part(s) shall be judged in accordance with the USMS rules.

Judgments should be made based on the actual rule, not on the swimmer's technique. For example, the breaststroke swimmer with one arm or leg shorter than the other may have a nonsymmetrical stroke or kick, but as long as the arm or leg action is simultaneous, it would meet that portion of the rule.

Rationale: To eliminate the ambiguity of the phrase "it is not judged" and replace it with proactive direction that a necessary accommodation may be applied by a meet referee for a part of the body that is absent or cannot be used by a swimmer with a physical disability, and to assure that all other body parts are judged according to the rules. This is consistent with the

protocol that the stroke and turn judge observes and reports, and the meet referee determines the validity of the disqualification.

CHANGES TO CONFORM TO USA SWIMMING FACILITIES STANDARDS

Pursuant to USMS article 601.4.7, changes to USA Swimming article 103 (Facilities Standards) may be recommended by the Rules Committee for adoption by the USMS House of Delegates.

There are no amendments to the USA Swimming facilities standards proposed for the 2022 annual meeting.

CHANGES TO CONFORM TO FINA RULES

Pursuant to USMS Article 601.4.8, if amendments to the FINA Masters Technical Rules are adopted between annual meetings of the House of Delegates, the corresponding portions of Part 1 shall be automatically adopted by USMS, except that such amendments may be altered, amended, repealed, or changed by a nine-tenths vote of the Rules Committee and a majority vote of the Executive Committee.

There are no pending FINA amendments to consider for the 2022 annual meeting. The next FINA Congress is scheduled for October 2022.
