- <u>A</u> Publication of Proposed Amendments All proposed changes to the Rules or Code shall be published and mailed to each LMSC and each Member of the House of Delegates not later than August 15.

601.3 MODIFICATION OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

<u>Proposed amendements may be modified in any manner by the Rules, Legislation, or Long Distance Swimming Committee, where appropriate, while under consideration by said Committee. Such modification must be germane to the subject matter and intent of the proposed change.</u>

601.4 ADOPTION OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

The USMS Rules of Competition and Code of Regulations may be altered amended, repealed or otherwise changed at the annual meeting of the House of Delegates and only as follows:

- Rules In even numbered years, Part One may be amended by a majority vote of the House of Delegate members present and voting, if submitted to and reported out favorably by the Rules Committee or by a two thirds vote of the House of Delegate members present and voting if submitted to and NOT reported out favorably by the Rules Committee.
- Long Distance In even numbered years, Part Three may be amended by majority vote of the House of Delegate members present and voting, if submitted to and reported out favorably by the Long Distance Swimming Committee or by a two-thirds vote by the House of Delegate members present and voting if submitted to and NOT reported out favorably by the Long Distance Committee.
- Legislation In odd-numbered years, the Preamble; Goals and Objectives; Glossary; Part Two; Part Four; Part Five; Part Six and Appendix D by a majority vote of the House of Delegate members present and voting, if submitted to and reported out favorably by the Legislation Committee or by a two-thirds vote of the House of Delegate members present and voting if submitted to and NOT reported out favorably by the Legislation Committee.
- <u>A</u> Emergency Legislation- By a nine-tenth vote of the House of Delegate members present and voting if not submitted in comformity with 601.4.1, 2, and .3 and only if properly submitted to, deemed an emergency, and reported out favorably by the appropriate committee as defined in Article 601.

 - Legislation In odd-numbered years, the Preamble; Goals and Objectives; Glossary, Part Two, Part Four, Part Five, Part Six; and Appendix D by a majority vote of the House of Delegates members present and voting if submitted to and reported out favorably by the Legislation Committee, or by a two-thirds vote of the House of Delegates members present and voting if submitted to and NOT reported favorably by the Legislation Committee.
