All events over 200 meters shall be deck-seeded, with slowest heats swum first in odd numbered years, and fastest heats swum first in even numbered years.

The following proposal was approved, as amended, by the House of Delegates.

MSR 10 102.18.2 (and 101.3.1 p 17) - By Pacific

B The backstroke start: The swimmers shall line up in the water facing the starting end, with both hands placed on the gutter or on the starting grips. For short course yards events, the feet may be placed in any position on the end of the pool, and the swimmer may assume any desired starting position which does not remove either foot completely from the water, nor either hand from the starting grips or the pool edge. For short course meters and long course meters events, prior to the command "take your mark" and until the feet leave the wall at the starting signal, the swimmer's feet, including toes, shall be placed under the surface of the water. For backstroke events in any course, Sstanding in or on the gutter is not permitted at any time either before or after the start. A backstroke starting block may not be used.

(Note: The FINA backstroke rules must be followed in all long course and short course meter events.)

The following proposal was withdrawn.

MSR 9 102.16.2 by San Diego - Imperial p 26 Effective January 1, 1990, one or more officials should be a <u>Collegiate</u>, USS or YMCA certified Referee, Starter, or Stroke and Turn Judge.
